Private Property Rights

2. What does "support for the rights of private property owners" mean to you? *

Allow for rezoning requests, streamline permitting processes, and deregulate burdensome regulations.

The main issue in my ward is sidewalks. I recently spearheaded a process to lower the max assessment for individual homeowners for sidewalks in front of their property from \$9,000 to \$3,500. While that helps alleviate the burden on the individual, it hinders the ability to afford more sidewalks. We need to reevaluate our priorities to ensure that sidewalks could be more fully funded.

10. What are the biggest opportunities Missoula has in infrastructure and transportation when it comes to housing and growth demands? *

Missoula can ease housing pressure by fixing what we have, like roads and sidewalks, without piling on new regulations

11. What is your position on connecting the City sewer and water to communities outside the current City limits? *

If the property owner asks to be connected we should allow it. But we shouldn't force annexation on owner's who don't want it.

Economic Development

12. What do you see as the primary challenges in Missoula's Commercial Real Estate development? *

Unnecessary red tape. It seems like the wave of out of staters coming in and raising housing prices has plateaued or even declined, so as long as the City doesn't over regulate we should be able to have a healthy housing market.

13. Which stakeholders would you contact as trusted sources on topics of economic development? *

Missoula Economic Partnership, MOR, private landlords, Chamber of Commerce, the Mayor, a Missoula legislature from both sides of the aisle, and my dad.

14. What is your definition of a "healthy real estate market" from both a commercial and residential point of view? *

One where it doesn't take a lifetime to sell or buy, both the buyer and the seller being satisfied with the purchase. Homes are affordable for all sorts of different families, small business don't get squeezed out, and we don't let overregulation choke growth or drive up prices.

Taxation & Fiscal Responsibility

My property tax stance led me to being appointed to the Governor's Property Tax Task Force last year. We need to curb our spending, focus on funding main things like infrastructure and public safety. We also need to curb the amount of levies being placed on the ballot, ensure proper voter turnout in order for levies to pass, have a sunset period on levies (instead of being in "perpetuity"), and revisit levies that have already been voted in in perpetuity.

16. What would you do as an elected official to demonstrate fiscal discipline? *

My voting record proves my commitment to fiscal discipline. Vote no on unnecessary or unaffordable items. Or vote no occasionally. Even once. I don't think some of my colleagues have voted no in their career...
